


# EGID Associate team

The European Genomic Institute of Diabetes (EGID) has recently inaugurated its new building with laboratories in the heart of the Lille University Hospital. EGID therefore launches this call to recruit starting and/or established scientists in research on diabetes and related diseases. The successful applicants will be selected based on their scientific excellence and their potential to complement and synergize with the existing research themes of EGID.



EGID is the first French institute dedicated to diabetes research comprising 3 leading Research Units totaling >200 persons. The units include the “integrative genomic and modelling of metabolic disease” group, headed by Prof Philippe Froguel, the “nuclear receptors, cardiovascular disease and diabetes” group, headed by Prof Bart Staels, and the “translational Research on diabetes and obesity” group, headed by Prof François Pattou (visit our website: <http://www.egid.fr>).

EGID has obtained the prestigious labels of laboratory of excellence and equipment of excellence (LIGAN-Personalized Medicine in genomics) by the French government. EGID currently hosts 3 laureates of the prestigious European Research Council. EGID researchers are supported by excellent core facilities and experienced teams providing state-of-the-art genomics (next generation sequencing and genotyping, bio informatics/statistics and system biology), biochemistry of lipids and lipoproteins, immune-phenotyping, extensive animal facilities (large and genetically modified animals), metabolic surgery, metabolic, immunologic and cardiovascular phenotyping.

EGID is located in Lille, the fourth largest French city (30 min from Brussels, 1 hour from Paris, 80 min from London by high-speed train) with the largest European hospital and research site (CHRU Lille & EURASANTE). The EGID units are affiliated with the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique (CNRS), Institut national de la santé et de la recherche médicale (INSERM), Lille University, Institut Pasteur de Lille, and the Lille University hospital.

Positions will remain open until filled; however applications received by 1 September 2017 will be given priority in the initial selection process.

## FUNDINGS

An "Associate Team" is awarded a grant up to 300 000 euros of welcome package (applicant salary excluded) for Associate Teams (EGID funding can also act as a catalyst for other local funding)

The Associate Team budget is dedicated to support:

- Personnel recruitments, (researchers, engineers, postdoctoral fellows, PhD students and interns) running costs, equipment and travel fees
- Stipends (15 k€ net salary bonus per year) during 3 years for the Applicant in addition to his basic salary.
