56th EASD Annual Meeting Poster Presentation Guidelines

GENERAL INFORMATION

- All Posters must be on uploaded to the virtual EASD Annual Meeting platform by September 20th at 11:59 CET.
- In mid-August you will receive your direct poster and e-Presentation upload link via e-mail from presentation@easd.org
- All poster sessions and e-Presentations will take the form of pre-recorded presentations. However, all presenters should be online and logged into the system during their session in order to answer questions

POSTER PREPARATION

- This e-poster must be uploaded only as a .pdf file.
- Please note that you are allowed only to submit a one-page .pdf file and that presentations attached to e-mails cannot be processed.
- To assure the best quality of your e-poster, we recommend that the .pdf file is in A0 format (landscape) with a minimum resolution of 200dpi.
- Each presentation should include a brief explanation of the Aims, Methods, Results and Conclusions.
- Please include any relevant disclosure information on your poster.
- All text, tables, and drawings should be large enough to be seen when zoomed in on
- Drawings may be originals or photographs, provided they are of appropriate size.
 Data should be in the form of tables and/or figures.
- Only English language may be used.
- No branding / advertising is allowed.
- The presentation number of your poster has been given to you in the detailed notification of acceptance. This number will also be included in the Provisional and Final Programme

e-PRESENTATION OF POSTERS with video

- An e-Presentation is a poster broken down to PowerPoint slides and will be presented similarly to an oral presentation.
- Please use the recorder function in PowerPoint to record a 3-4 minute presentation




• Your presentation should be limited to a maximum of 5 slides and should replicate exactly what is seen on your poster .pdf file

e-PRESENTATION OF POSTERS with audio only

- Please use the audio recorder function in the presentation upload system to record a 3-4 minute presentation for your e-Poster (link will be sent in mid-August)
- If you already have a audio recording in MP3 Format, you can also upload the MP3-File to the narration recorder of the upload system.



What you will need:

- A computer
- Headset (if possible) plugged in and ready (use of a microphone is also possible)
- A webcam
- A wired internet connection with a 5 Mbit upstream internet connection is recommended
- Google Chrome is the recommended browser to use
- Zoom: The Zoom application can be used as a browser-based plug-in (on Google Chrome) or as a desktop client by downloading and installing the Zoom application on your computer. Both options allow full functionality and you may choose which way is the most convenient for you
